Meet the CEO Presenters



Irene Natividad, President, Global Summit of Women

Irene Natividad is President of the Global Summit of Women, a 20-year old annual gathering of women leaders in business and government who come together to share strategies for increasing women's economic empowerment globally. Ms. Natividad also serves as Co-Chair of Corporate Women Directors International, which conducts research and brings together women corporate directors from around the world on issues of corporate governance. In 2004, she was selected by *Women's eNews* as one of the "21 Leaders for the 21st Century." She was named in 1997 as one of "25 Most Influential Working Mothers" by *Working Mother Magazine*, and was also named in 1988 as one of the "100 Most Powerful Women in America" by *Ladies Home Journal*.



Sakie Fukushima, Chairman and Managing Director, Korn/Ferry International Japan

Sakie Fukushima is the Chairman of Korn/Ferry International in Tokyo and a leader in the firm's Global Consumer Market in Japan. Ms. Fukushima specializes in placing executives in senior management positions in American and European multinational corporations operating in Japan. Prior to joining the firm in 1991, she was a consultant at Bain & Company, in Boston and in the Tokyo office. She has also served as a consultant in the Boston headquarters of Braxton International and as a Japanese instructor at Harvard University. Ms. Fukushima is also a member of the Board of Directors of Sony Corporation and Benesse Corporation.



Merle Aiko Okawara, Chairman and CEO, JC Comsa Corporation

Merle Aiko Okawara currently holds the title of CEO of JC Comsa Corporation. As an expert in consumer markets, Ms. Okawara has held senior positions at numerous food and consumer product companies, including CEO of eBay Japan. In the late 1960s, Ms. Okawara bet on Japanese consumers' willingness to experiment with Western-style food products. Under her leadership, JC Comsa has become the nation's top producer of frozen and chilled ethnic foods. Additionally, she has won numerous awards including Woman Entrepreneur of the Year awards from the New Business Conference, Nikkan Kogyo New Paper, and Veuve Clicquot (France).



Yukiko Ogasawara, President, The Japan Times

Yukiko Ogasawara is President and Representative Director of The Japan Times and, concurrently, she sits on the board of Nifco Inc., the newspaper's parent company. Born in Japan, Ms. Ogasawara spent most of her childhood in the USA. After graduation, she taught arts and crafts to children while an Artist-in-Residence at the Francisco Middle School in San Francisco. In 2003, Ms. Ogasawara returned to Tokyo to take up a position as Assistant General Manager of the International Division in Nifco Inc. and was elected a director of the company in 2005. She was appointed as President of The Japan Times in March 2006. She also has recently become a director of the Children's Express, a non-profit organization which seeks to educate children in writing, self-expression and artistic expression.
